## Position Title: Iwi Network Lead

My position is in the Population Health and Innovation Group, and I report to and support the Director Māori Health and Wellbeing.

Key activities include:

- Developing, maintaining and strengthening relationships across the PHO's Iwi network, through the provision of expert support, advice and guidance as and when required, with a particular emphasis on assigned Providers.
- Collaborating to co-design process between Iwi Providers and the PHO Teams.
- Developing and collating relevant resources and promotion of PHO services across the Iwi network.
- Promotion of services and resources available through the PHO.
- Collaborating with Iwi and your team to provide cohesive communication and services.

- Contributing to a well-regarded team within and across our network service environment.
  - Effective communication with key stakeholders to ensure alignment of appropriate resources, activities and objectives.
  - Active participation in internal, local, and regional hui and fora as appropriate to support achievement of the above outcomes.
